

Drystone Wall Repair Volunteer Role Description

About the Cumbria Wildlife Trust

As one of 46 independent Wildlife Trusts, we are a local wildlife conservation charity. What is a Drystone Wall Repair Volunteer?

We are looking for experienced drystone wall volunteers to help us maintain the network of drystone walls around our internationally important nature reserves of Hutton Roof Crags and Park Wood. The boundaries are essential to help us manage grazing livestock on the nature reserves. You will join a friendly and dedicated team of staff and volunteers.

What's in it for you?

- Getting out and about in nature at some of Cumbria Wildlife Trust's most beautiful nature reserves
- Having opportunities to be part of how the nature reserve is managed, with grazing an important tool to help us restore these habitats
- Health and wellbeing benefits
- Becoming part of a friendly and dedicated team of volunteers and staff
- Tools and PPE will be provided

What's involved?

- Spending time out and about on site, working as part of a team to rebuild drystone boundary walls.
- Volunteers need to be physically fit to access the work areas and carry out the task.

- The repairs mainly consist of replace wall tops, but some sections may need a complete rebuild.
- Volunteers must have experience in drystone wall construction as, unfortunately, we are unable to offer training at this time.
- This role will have minimal supervision so volunteers will need to work independently.

Who would suit this role?

This role will suit:

- Experienced drystone wallers who enjoy working outdoors.
- Are aged 18 or over
- Are able to work independently and are physically fit
